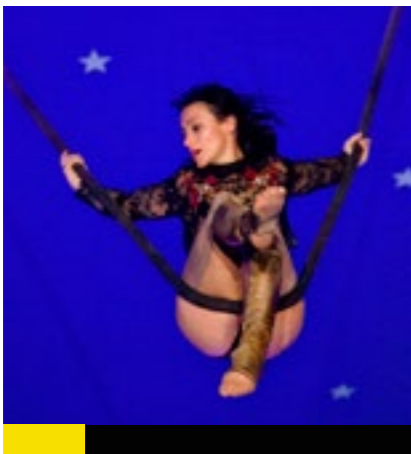
(Stage Response Front for Non-Exclusive Theatre and Circus)

Studied in Carampa Circus School, (Madrid) and graduated in Circus Arts in DOCH, Sweden. In 2009 she founded the Atempo Circ company traveling throughout Europe, Korea and Greenland.

As a freelance artist she has worked with Andrés Lima, Firenza Guidi, "The Hole 2", Cirkus Cirkör, Circo Wonderland, Circ Cric, 7 Doigts de la Main, Burnt out Punks, Gorilla Circus, Hurja Ruuth, Krystallpalast among others. She has obtained several awards: Malabart 2017 (flying rope).

Coordinated and directed the 1st and 2nd International Circus Festival of Valencia "Contorsions". He is a founding member of the AVC, Associació Valenciana de Circ (2003) and of the APCCV, (2010).

“Studied music until he was 16 years old. He has trained in performing arts since 2003, studying at A.V.C. Associació Valenciana de Circ (Valencia), E.M.C.A. He teaches in Europe, Asia and Latin America. It’s at The head of projects like “SLKH Produccions” audio -visual production company; “La Virgule” (residence center for nomadic artists in Toulouse) or “Festina Lente” itinerant festival on sailboats.

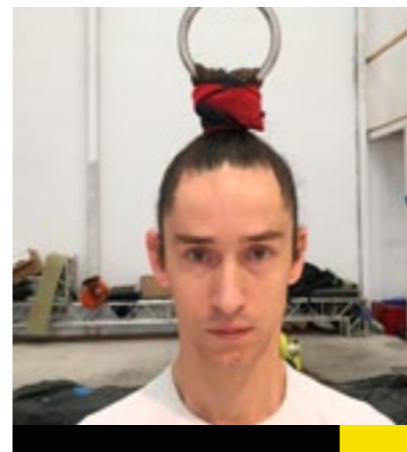


SUSO IMBERNÓN

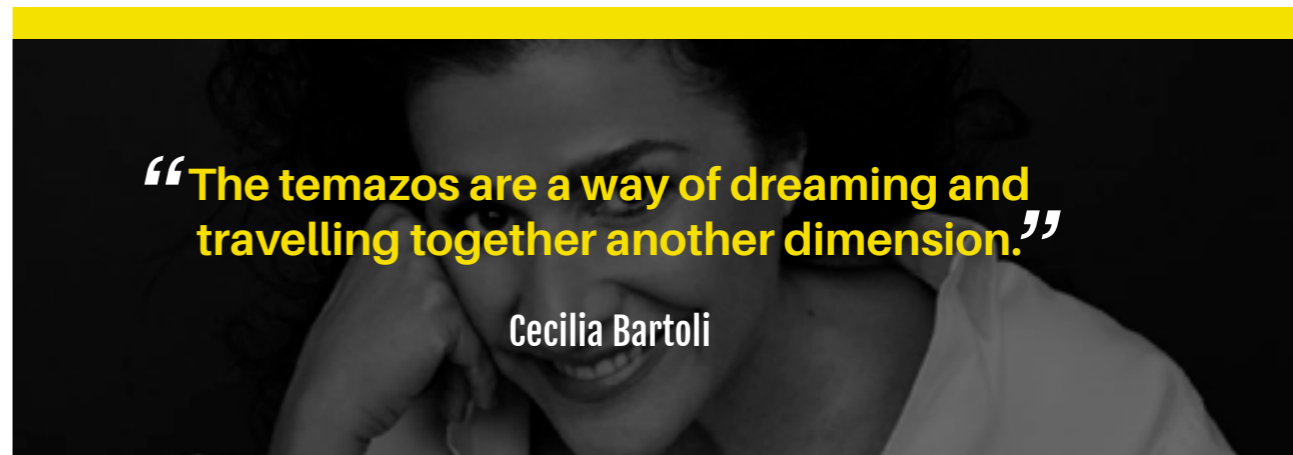


MATÍAS MARRÉ
